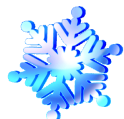

## Interview with National Eastern Region Vice Pres. Paul Cohen

Paul Cohen is a senior at Vineland High School in New Jersey. He is our Eastern Region Vice President, New Jersey's State President, and Vineland High School's President. I hope you enjoy this interview with this impressive National Officer.

### How long have you been involved in FBLA?
